THIRD DECLARATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Town of Hopkinton has suffered widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property (or there is imminent threat of the same) resulting from the **COVID-19 Virus**, and the Hopkinton Town Council, has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property.

Now therefore, be it proclaimed by the Hopkinton Town Council:

Section 1 – The State of Emergency is hereby extended for the Town of Hopkinton;

Section 2 – The Town’s Emergency Operations Plan has been implemented;

Section 3 – That *second* State of Emergency issued on March 23rd, 2020 shall continue in effect until March 30th, 2020;

Section 4 – That this *third* State of Emergency shall take effect upon the expiration of the second State of Emergency on March 30th and extend through April 6th, 2020.

§30-15-13 Local disaster emergencies. – (a) A local disaster emergency may be declared only by the principal executive officer of a political subdivision. It shall not be continued or renewed for a period in excess of seven (7) days except by, or with the consent of, the governing board of the political subdivision. Any order or proclamation declaring, continuing, or terminating a local disaster emergency shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the city or town clerk.

(b) The effect of a declaration of a local disaster emergency is to activate the mitigation response and recovery aspects of any and all applicable local disaster emergency plans and to authorize the furnishing of aid and assistance thereunder.
