Town Manager William McGarry reported. On April 5, 2017, he conducted a

town-wide department head staff meeting held in the HPD conference room. We

discussed the status of many ongoing projects in town, and department heads

brought everyone in attendance up-to-date on their respective activities. He

reported during the last two weeks, he worked closely with Brian Rosso and

PRISM CEO Tom Gentz to assemble the necessary documents to forward to

National Grid and the Rhode Island Infrastructure Bank, regarding the purchase of the 539 streetlights, the subsequent transition to LED lights and the financing of the entire project. This is a work in progress.
